POST-SERVICE INSTRUCTIONS

VI PEEL

ENVIRONMENT

Consider the week post-service as if sunburned - avoid sun exposure, sweating, and heat. If sun exposure cannot be avoided, apply sun block SPF 30+ UVA and UVB. Sunscreen with titanium oxide, zinc oxide provides broader protection.

BEHAVIORS

Cleansing: Cleansing should occur prior to showering. Hot water should be avoided. Avoid use of washcloths or machine brushes in the first week post-service. Do not pull, pick, rub, or force the removal of skin. Forced removal of skin can result in irritation and possible hyperpigmentation. Skin should remain hydrated during the peeling process and can be aided with the use of a topical like Aquaphor.

Product Use: On the day of service, 4 hours after service, use the first of the towelettes that were provided. Use towelettes in accordance with the aftercare booklet provided with a minimum interval of 4 hours between use. All towelettes should be used in the first 48 hours. Do not use in any location to which VI Peel was not applied. Avoid use under the eye or on the eyelid. Towelettes may cause a light stinging sensation. Itching is not uncommon and can be remedied with the use of a hydrocortisone cream or oral antihistamine. Application of the post Treatment Repair Cream is encouraged in the first 7 days. Resumption of actives can occur 7 to 14 days post-service.

Observation: Skin will appear tan, bronzed, or pink in the first 2 days post-service. Skin may become tight before peeling begins. Visible peeling will vary from person to person. Peeling will peak between days 3 and 5 post-service. Peeling typically begins around the mouth, peeling outward, with the forehead and neck being the last to peel.
